

Dear friends in Christ,

Can it really be June? Already? Yes, indeed it is, so let's look ahead at some summer events that will be front and center for us at CtR.

Foremost on our calendar is 07/0707, the groundbreaking date for our new church home. That's only five short weeks away from this weekend. We are still ironing out all the details, but here is what I can tell you now. We'll celebrate at the 5 p.m. Mass that day (it's a Saturday), and then after Mass, go out to the field on the north side of the current church where the new sanctuary will be built. We are making arrangements to have a tent as even at that hour, the sun will be fairly strong. We'll gather around to bless and break the ground where we will make our new home, and after that brief ceremony, we will continue the celebration with a parish picnic.

You may remember our 25th anniversary picnic a few years ago where we had James Coney Island hot dogs. That was such a big hit with everyone that we are planning to do the same for the groundbreaking. We'll supply the world famous James Coney Island dogs and ask that you bring everything else. You are welcome to bring coolers of drinks and, if you don't like hot dogs, feel free to bring a picnic basket of whatever you might like to eat that day! Let's make it a real parish-wide picnic. You don't have to bring enough potato salad or Fritos to serve the whole parish, but let's share with our neighbors.

I also ask that you bring your own lawn chairs and pop-up tents if you like, as I don't imagine we'll be able to fit everyone under the one big tent. We'll continue the festivities until dark, probably around 8:30 or 9 p.m. You are welcome to come and go as you like, but remember, the groundbreaking ceremony and the blessing of the building site will take place first, immediately following the 5 p.m. Mass.

I am sure we'll have more details in the coming weeks, but I wanted you to get that event circled in red on your calendar. Make plans to join us for this historic day for CtR as we give thanks to God for the gift of our parish church. It is a time of thanksgiving as we look forward to "Our Faith, Our Future."

Speaking of "Our Faith, Our Future," I'll give you an update report next week on the status of our Capital Campaign to build the new church. It's going exceptionally well and I thank all of you who continue to make your payments on your pledges. Please continue to do so in a timely manner. It helps us to stay on top of the many, many details that go into a campaign of this size.

Later in June we have our annual junior high summer day camp, June 11-15. Registration forms are available in the office, but please sign up this week as we are approaching max capacity in terms of campers we can take. We are already filled up for Vacation Bible School, which will run the week of June 18-22. Each year we stretch as far as we can to take as many kids as possible into VBS but there comes a point where we are at capacity. We do have a waiting list for VBS. If there are openings, we will take them on a first come, first serve basis.

Please remember that you can sign up your children for next year's Religious Education classes anytime over the summer. In the past we've had a hold on

registrations in June and July, but we are trying a new approach this year. Registration forms will be available anytime throughout the summer in the parish office. Why not take five minutes this week and come by to complete the registration? You will feel good that you've planned ahead and gotten that chore crossed off your "To Do" list and you will be helping us by beating the rush in the fall.

Also, in the RE department, we are continuing to interview candidates for the Director of Religious Education position. Please keep our search committee in your prayers. I thank them for the dedication and diligent work in this area for our parish. I am hopeful that we will have someone in place in the next couple of weeks.

Finally, please join me in thanking God for the gift of two new priests who were ordained for the Archdiocese on June 2. Father Michael Earthman and Father Vincent Tran will be great additions to our presbyterate. I taught both of them Homiletics (preaching) at St. Mary's Seminary a few years ago. Both were fine students and I am sure that they will be terrific priests. Still, they are only two men, and our need for priests in the Archdiocese is much greater than that. In making the priestly assignments this year, some positions were not filled in parishes because there were not enough priests to fill the many needs. Let us always remember to pray for vocations each and every day, and to actively encourage young men and young adults to listen for the voice of God calling them to serve the Church.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

LITURGY CORNER

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Three Persons – One God

Today we honor and celebrate the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (three persons in one God.) It took the early Church two centuries and great effort to discern the final doctrine of the Most Holy Trinity. It was at the Council of Nicea, in 325 AD, that the doctrine of the Trinity was decreed.

All language struggles to capture the essence of ultimate mystery. And certainly the Most Holy Trinity is the ultimate Mystery!

In the eighth century, John of Damascus provided an example of the divine Trinity that can be understood, in English, as three persons, one God, in a divine dance of being and acting, saving and redeeming. The Greek term

that John used was *Perichoresis*, which describes the three persons of the Trinity as mutually “indwelling” or “permeating.” A similar Greek word, *perichoreuein*, which means “to dance around,” was used as a metaphor for the relations of the Trinity, thus the image of the three persons in a great, divine dance of life.

Of course, as already noted, no image can capture the complete essence of such an ineffable mystery as the Triune God. But as an image, the divine dance of the Trinity, asking that God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit—“be near to the people formed in your image, close to the world your love brings to life” (Alternative Opening Prayer, Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, *Roman Missal*).
