

Dear friends in Christ,

We are "engaging" in a first for our parish at Christ the Redeemer this weekend. We are hosting an Engaged Encounter weekend retreat for 33 couples preparing for the Sacrament of Matrimony.

Couples wishing to marry in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston are prepared for the sacrament in their individual home parishes, but they are also asked to participate in one of two pastoral programs designed specifically for engaged couples. One of those options, Engaged Encounter, is a weekend retreat that was developed as an outreach to couples.

On an EE weekend, the couples are asked to go deeper into their love for one another and look at a broad range of topics that confront newly married couples. They are led through a series of short talks and workshops presented by two experienced married couples, one a "senior" couple (usually married 20+ years) and a "junior couple" (married usually from five to 15 years). A priest is also present for the EE weekend to present the teachings of the Church and the theology of marriage. Topics covered include Marriage as a Sacrament, conflict resolution, marriage morality and sexuality, and financial planning among many others.

EE weekends are normally held at either the Cameron Retreat Center in the Medical Center or at the Christian Renewal Center in Dickinson, but with more than 150 parishes in the archdiocese preparing couples for marriage, you can imagine that the number of available spaces in any given weekend quickly fill. It is not uncommon for there to be a waiting list of four or five months before a couple can be placed in a weekend.

To combat that lengthy delay, I began a practice many years ago when I was at St. Michael Church in Houston that we would host an EE weekend at the parish. I later took the practice to my assignment at St. John Vianney and I am happy to say we are doing it here this weekend at CtR. It enables us to get a number of couples prepared at once and to expedite the steps leading to their weddings. These "in-house" weekends have proved to be a great success.

The weekend retreat is nearly identical to the one held at a retreat center, with the chief difference being that the couples go home each night. However, most couples don't mind getting to sleep in their own beds! It makes for a long weekend as we start on Friday night and return on Saturday morning to work all day and into the late night, and then again on Sunday in the afternoon. The weekend concludes with Mass, and the couples this weekend will be joining us at the 5 p.m. Mass on Sunday.

As I mentioned, the EE weekend is one of two ways couples are prepared, the other being meeting with a Sponsor Couple from the parish. We are blessed to offer both models of preparation at CtR. I am thankful that Adrian and Cherrie Cavestany from CtR are serving as our "Senior Couple" this weekend. They are veterans of EE, having led countless weekends retreat over their 40+ years of marriage. Thank you, Adrian and Cherrie, for your great support to these young couples. Mark and Valerie Therrien from CtR will also be working the weekend for us as a support couple. They attended the EE weekend when they

were engaged and now are coming back to help as a married couple, so I thank them for their generosity of time as well.

I tell you all of this so that you might keep these 33 couples in your prayer this weekend. These couples need the prayer and support of the Church as they begin their lives together. Marriage is not a private act. It's public worship and we all have a responsibility to lift them up as they enter into this most sacred of moments. CtR is well represented at the weekend, too, as I believe 12 or 13 of the couples on this weekend will be married right here in the coming months. If you or someone you know is thinking about being married in the Catholic Church, it is important that they begin to prepare early. We are already filling up many dates for weddings in 2008. Also, if you are a married couple and would like to get involved in the ministry of helping prepare couples for this beautiful sacrament (possibly as a Sponsor Couple), please contact our Director of Family Life, Margaret Carnicle, at mcarnicle@ctrcc.com or at the parish office. We are always in need of couples to assist us in this great ministry. You don't have to have the "perfect" marriage to be a Sponsor Couple, as if such a "perfect" marriage really exists. You just have to have a love of God and a desire to help others grow in God's love in their marriage.

In other news, I am very proud to tell you that as of last month, the parishioners of CtR had contributed more than \$6,700 to the Diocesan Social Ministries. Not that we want to brag, but that was the eighth highest total of the more than 150 parishes in the entire archdiocese. That's quite an accomplishment and speaks well of our outreach. Thank you very much for your generosity and continued commitment to the most needy among us.

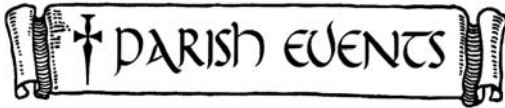

LITURGY CORNER

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

O Sacrament Most Holy

Today the Church observes the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On this day we honor and commemorate the great mystery of the Eucharist – Christ, whole and undivided, body and soul present to us in his Body and Blood.

Some parishes mark this day with special rites and celebrations. For example, there may be exposition and benediction of the Most Holy Eucharist, when the Eucharist is visibly exposed, usually on a monstrance, for adoration. There are readings from scripture, songs of praise and psalms, preaching, and silent adoration. The celebration ends with benediction, when the priest or deacon blesses the faithful with the Eucharist in the monstrance.

Some parishes may mark this day with a traditional Eucharistic procession. After Mass, the Eucharist, which

had been consecrated at that Mass, is placed in the monstrance and carried in procession outside the church. Some parishes process through the neighborhood, singing songs and chants.

There is no greater way to celebrate this solemnity, however, than. For the Church to come together, as the visible expression of the Body of Christ, head and members, gathered around the altar of the Lord. There we hear the scriptures proclaimed, we pray and intercede for the world, the Church, the poor. There the Church offers to God, in faith, the gifts of bread and wine, and through the Eucharistic Prayer God gives back to us his very Son – Christ Jesus, present in the Eucharist, the Bread of heaven given for the life of the world.
