Dear friends in Christ,

This week will be one of our busiest of the year at CtR as we host our annual Summer Vacation Bible School. We will host more than 370 children over the next five days with more than 150 teachers, aides and teen volunteers. It's quite an undertaking and it is all under the direction of Jill Dimiceli, our pre-school coordinator. Keep her and the team in your prayers this week. It's a great week of faith and fun for the children, but it is a lot of work, too. We are very thankful for the time and effort that Jill and the entire team put into making the week such a success.

VBS necessitates a slight change in our daily schedule at the parish, so those of you who come to Mass during the week, please note that we will begin 30 minutes earlier, at 8:30 a.m., this week only. In addition, we'll be in the chapel instead of the church this week as VBS will have some of its activities set up in the sanctuary. This should not prove to be too problematic, and remember that it is for this week only. We'll be back to the normal schedule next week.

Fr. Ryszard is leaving this Sunday for his annual trip home to see family and friends in his native Poland. We wish him a safe journey and a speedy return. He should be back on July 1. Until that time, I'll be flying solo, and I ask your patience if I am delayed in getting to your calls or e-mails.

I will also be out of the office for a few days this coming week as I am participating in a program called *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* for the priests of the archdiocese. (That means daily Mass only on Monday of this week; Deacon Jim and Deacon Phillip will lead communion services the rest of the week, and there will be no confessions on Wednesday. Again, that's this week only.) This is a program hosted by the Ongoing Formation of Priests Committee, which I co-chair with Fr. Norbert Maduzia of St. Ignatius parish. We coordinate a variety of programs, workshops and seminars for priests to continue their education and help them be better ministers in their parishes.

The *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* program is one that we are very excited to bring to the Archdiocese. It is presented by the Catholic Leadership Institute and it is a two-and-a-half year program of several workshops and follow-up meetings designed to help us bring good leadership and proven practices to our priestly ministry.

Pastoral leadership training gives witness to the good news of priesthood. *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* is a world-class curriculum that celebrates the ministerial experience of all participants. Given the demands of ministry and complexity of running parishes, the ability to more effectively lead and invite others to leadership is paramount to building authentic, vibrant Catholic communities.

Using Jesus Christ as the ultimate shepherd and model of leadership, the *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* curriculum for clergy was specifically designed to help Catholic priests overcome the challenges today of a diminishing number of clergy and more complex circumstances for priestly ministry. The goal is to minimize the frustration and energy spent on our administrative roles and maximizes the joy and time spent on the pastoral duties for which we were uniquely ordained. The impact will be more -- I hope! -- Holy, healthy, and happy shepherds of vibrant parish communities, leading more people to a deeper relationship with Christ.

In a few weeks I will complete my third year as your pastor at CtR. It has been a great and exciting time for me personally, and I hope that I have been able to help you grow

in your love for our God. Undoubtedly, the Lord is calling us to a deeper relationship with one another and His Church. The excitement for our new church home (more on that next week in detail) is rising every day. It's a great time to be at CtR and, if I can say so myself, a great time to be your pastor!

However, I will be honest and say that the daily demands of being a pastor are a great challenge. A blessing, too, but a challenge nonetheless. The work is endless, and much of it is administrative in nature. Deacon Phillip has been a great blessing to me in that regard but there is still much which must go through the pastor's desk. It is my hope that the *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* program will equip me with more skills and tools to more effectively lead the parish and to call others within the parish to positions of leadership as well. Together, the body of Christ, His holy Church, is growing. I want us to grow in all the right ways and be good stewards of our gifts and talents. If I can do but that (and learn to lead more efficiently instead of burning myself out) then this program will have achieved its end.

Please keep me and the 33 other priests (and one bishop!) in your prayers as we embark on *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* this week. I'll be at Holy Name Retreat Center in Houston, and may sneak back over one night to catch up on some work, but I'll be back in the office on Friday. I will keep you updated on the *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* program over the next few years. It should be a great program for our priests and people of the archdiocese.

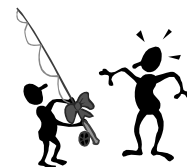

Father's Day Blessing

The *Book of Blessings* notes that in the United States the observance of Father's Day has an important place in American life. Because of this, the Church provides a model for its celebration within the context of our faith. As a civil celebration, Father's Day allows us to recognize and celebrate the roles of these men in our lives, but blesses them for the image they can be of God, our heavenly Father.

The *Book of Blessings* provides a blessing prayer that may be used at Mass. At the final blessing of the

Mass, fathers who are present may be invited to stand. The Prayer of Blessing ends with the general blessing of all present.

Fathers have given us life and love. In return, we remember all fathers living and dead, and we bless them in our prayer for the many ways they have mirrored God's love to us.
