

Dear friends in Christ,

Thank you to all who helped make our 2nd annual Cereal Sunday a big success last weekend. The folks at Cypress Assistance Ministry were truly thankful for the great boost to their food pantry. Remember that we always accept food donations for CAM any weekend, and as I said at the masses last weekend, we will soon have a designated monthly food drive weekend. More details on that as they develop, but if you are interested in assisting us in the effort, please let me know. Again, thanks to all who gave so generously.

This Sunday more than 40 of our parishioners leave for a week-long pilgrimage in Rome. This is our second consecutive year to go to the Eternal City to celebrate with the archbishop of Galveston-Houston. Last year, Archbishop Fiorenza received the Pallium from the Holy Father and this year, Archbishop DiNardo will do the same. The Pallium is a two-inch band of cloth, made from sheep's wool, that is placed around the neck of all archbishops as a sign of their office. The archbishop wears the Pallium in his own diocese only, usually at large, ceremonial masses. It is a reminder of the connection between Holy See and the local church. It's a moving and beautiful ceremony held at St. Peter's each year on June 29, the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul.

While in Rome, our tour group will see all the wonderful and historic sites of that ancient and eternal city, from the Colosseum to the catacombs to the Roman Forum and all the major churches of Rome: St. Peter's, St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls and St. Mary Major. We will also take a trip one day to Assisi to visit the city of both St. Francis and St. Clare. (That's always one of my favorite places to visit. It's hard to imagine a more beautiful city than Assisi!) We'll be joining about 350 other pilgrims from the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston traveling for the Pallium Mass, and once again, Christ the Redeemer Church is bringing the largest contingent. Archbishop DiNardo is one of three American archbishops receiving the Pallium from Pope Benedict XVI this year along with Archbishop George Niederauer of San Francisco and Archbishop Donald Wuerl of Washington, D.C. (By the way, Archbishop Wuerl is the former bishop of Pittsburgh, where Archbishop DiNardo served as a priest under him for many years. They are old friends and I suspect there will be a lot of Pittsburghers joining us in Rome!)

There is a reception after the Pallium Mass at the North American College for all the visitors from U.S. and we'll be there for that, too. If it is anything like our trip last year, I know it will be a great and spirit-filled trip. Keep us in your prayers and know that we will remember all of the Christ the Redeemer parishioners in our prayers at our various masses throughout the city of Rome.

The Archdiocese once again will host a program this summer for young adult Catholics called Cafe Catholica. This is a program close to my heart as I helped start it and hosted it for several years while at St. Michael Church. It has a "coffee house" theme, and will run on four Mondays in July, starting July 10, at St. Vincent de Paul Church, on Holcombe at Buffalo Speedway, not too far from the Texas Medical Center. It begins with Mass each night at 6:30 p.m., followed by food and then a program at 7:30 p.m. This year's theme is "Highway to Heaven" and will feature Archbishop DiNardo (speaking on July 10 and 17) and Bishop Joe Vasquez (7/24) and Bishop Vincent Rizzotto (7/31). The bishops will reflect on the four parts of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. It's a great opportunity to network with other young adult Catholics (ages 18-35) in the archdiocese in a relaxed evening of prayer, education and fellowship. I know CtR is preparing a group to attend, so contact C.J. McCarren in the parish office for more information. It will be great to have some CtR young adults in attendance.

Another program offered by the Archdiocese is Life Awareness. It's a weekend retreat designed to assist single, young adults, ages 18-45, who feel a tug toward a vocation to

priesthood or consecrated life. During the weekend, the participants listen to presentations made by priests, brothers and sisters and engage in discussions as they discern what God is saying in their lives. The Life Awareness weekend is a great first step and a way to get solid information about Church vocations. Life Awareness weekend will be July 7-9 (Friday evening through Sunday lunch) at Holy Name Retreat Center in Houston. For more information, see the archdiocesan web site at www.archgh.org.

As many of our parishioners are traveling this summer on vacation, I encourage you to check out in advance the local mass times where you will be on Sunday. The internet is a great assistance in that regard. There are some mass times web sites, but I find it easiest to use a search engine by simply typing the city where I will be along with the words "Catholic" or "mass times." You will usually be directed to the local diocese's home page and from there you can find a church close to where you will be. After I leave Rome, I am going to Mackinac Island, MI to officiate at a friend's wedding. It's a small island in northern Michigan in the middle of Lake Huron, but I found the mass times of the local church on the web! Another parishioner is going to the North Pole this summer and found that there is a church in North Pole, Alaska where she can attend mass. I will give you one guess as to the name of the church at the North Pole. That's right: St. Nicholas! (And, yes, that's a true story!)

While traveling, don't forget about your home parish, however. Please remember to send in or drop off your weekly offering for CtR. Just because you are gone does not mean that our expenses stop. We still have to pay the electric bill! We gratefully appreciate you remembering to support CtR, whether you are here or away. By the way, I failed to mention that last week's collection on Corpus Christi Sunday all went to St. Mary's Seminary. It is a long-standing practice in our archdiocese to send the entire weekly offering on Corpus Christi to the seminary for its operating expenses. Thank you for your support of the education of our future priests. Yes, it means we have to budget for no income that week, but it is a worthwhile practice that we are happy to support. If you would like to assist us in making up for that missed week, I would ask that you place a little more in this week's collection. Thank you for your kindness to the Church.

LITURGY CORNER

Glory to God Part II

“Glory to God (Quote from *Music in Catholic Worship*, 1972)

66. This ancient hymn of praise is now given a new poetic and singable translation. It may be introduced by celebrant, cantor, or choir. The restricted use of the Gloria, i.e., only on Sundays outside Advent and Lent and on solemnities and feasts, emphasizes its special and solemn character. The new text offers many opportunities for alternation of choir and people in poetic parallelisms. The “Glory to God” also provides an opportunity for the choir to sing alone on festive occasions.”

In the Roman Ritual of 1970, promulgated by Pope Paul VI and the sacramentary we are still using to this day throughout the English speaking world, the **Glory or Glory to God is the “Hymn”** (*hymn: noun, A song of praise that Christians sing to God*) of the Sunday Celebration of the Eucharist. By “Hymn,” we mean the FORM in which it is written in the missal, such as in the poetic forms of a sonnet or that of free verse.

In our celebration of the Eucharist, the majority of the texts whether sung or spoken are intended to be antiphonal in form with a dialogue between the Priest (The Lord be with you) and the assembly (And also with you) or the Cantor and assembly or the Choir (if present) and assembly. This is the manner in which the Responsorial Psalm is sung – a refrain intoned by the cantor and than repeated by the assembly. This is also the **intended form** of the music for the Communion procession.

Since the early 1970’s however, American composers have been using the antiphonal form when writing settings of the Glory to God rather than the form intended by the Roman Missal, the style of a **through-composed Hymn**. Publishers saw this as an easy means of making their products sell faster and the American Church began a tradition of singing the Glory to God using the antiphonal form. Often, **composers** give ONLY a refrain to the assembly, leaving the verses to be sung by the cantors or choirs. However the Gloria is sung we should always bear in mind that during the Introductory Rites of the Mass there are two preeminent parts: **The Gathering Song and Opening Prayer, all else is secondary**. At different times of the year we may emphasize the Penitential Rite by singing a more elaborate setting, but the fact remains that the two most important parts are those which serve as bookends for the Gathering rites of the Mass.
