

Dear friends in Christ,

Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers today! Whether you are blessed to be able to visit or call your mother today or whether she has gone on to the heavenly kingdom, we remember them all and give thanks to God for the gift of motherhood. How appropriate that we celebrate Mother's Day in the month when we traditionally honor Mary, the mother of our Lord. Our pre-school children had a very nice and lovely May crowning of our image of Mary inside the church a few weeks ago and plans are underway to give a good cleaning to our outdoor statue of the Blessed Virgin. Make sure you set aside some time to remember both your earthly mother and heavenly mother in prayer on this special day.

More than 220 of our mothers in the parish got a special gift this weekend from their children when they witnessed their sons and daughters receive First Communion on Saturday. Our First Communion celebrations are always some of the most beautiful liturgies of the year for us. Because of the great number of children, we had to split the class again this year and have two masses. The children were dressed in their Sunday best and all were excited to receive the Lord for the first time in communion. We congratulate all of them and their families. A special thanks to all of our 2nd grade religious education teachers who prepared the children for this most important sacrament.

The attitude and approach of the children toward their First Communion should serve as a good model for all of us as we come forward to receive Eucharist each week. Think back to your First Communion. Were you not excited and eager to receive the Lord, too? Now, ask yourself what is your attitude today. Does receiving our Lord in Eucharist still generate that same excitement in us? If not, why not? Sometimes when we do something repeatedly it is easy to lose our enthusiasm for it. That's a dangerous thing when we are talking about our Lord!

If you are in your 40s, you've probably received communion more than 2,000 times in your life. If you are in your 60s, it is probably more than 3,000. Receiving communion is not something we can quantify, however. Whether it is your First Communion or your 2,001st Communion, the attitude must be the same. We need to rediscover the joy that can only come when we meet our God in His Body and Blood. Make sure you are preparing yourself well before you approach the table of God's great sacrifice.

This would also be a good time to look at our dress for Mass and communion. As I said, the children were all decked out for First Communion, and while I don't expect to see First Communion dresses or suits every week in the congregation, I think we would do well to make sure our appearance before the Lord is appropriate. As we get closer to summer, the shorts tend to get shorter and t-shirts seem to become the norm for many people at Mass. I am certainly not the fashion police, but I do ask that we take seriously what we do each Sunday and dress appropriately for church. I see some clothing that is, quite frankly, more appropriate for the pool than the pew. You don't have to dress to impress, but how we present ourselves on Sundays goes a long way in shaping our attitude toward prayer and worship. Think about it. That's all I ask.

You may have seen a large dumpster in the back parking lot last week filled to the brim. It may seem like a small thing to many of you but that represented a lot of hard work and sweat on the part of our parish staff. We took a full day out of the office and worked to clean out the back storage shed and

the amount of junk we tossed was staggering. I want to thank the staff for their hard work that day and especially Stacie McKay, who coordinated and organized the entire process for us. It may not have much day-to-day impact on many of you, but trust me, nearly all of our ministries will benefit as a result of having more storage space in the long run. Let it be an inspiration to you for your own "spring cleaning." Trust me, it feels good to throw stuff away!

Remember, registration for RE classes continues throughout this month. Also, we are getting close to being full for Vacation Bible School. We have made accommodations to take more children for VBS this year, but we are going to have to limit it at some point if only because we are totally out of classroom space. We are using just about every inch of our education building. Make sure to check with the office this week for more information on how to register.

LITURGY CORNER

Blessed Pope John XXII
1881-1963

Angelo Guisepe Roncalli was born to a poor family of sharecroppers in a small Italian village. The fourth of 14 children, he was raised in a devout Catholic home in which the family recited the rosary daily and prayed each evening.

Angelo attended the local village school. He showed obvious intellect and the school sponsored his studies at the Bergamo seminary, which he entered in 1892. It was only a few years later that he would enter the Secular Franciscan order, professing vows in 1897.

Following his profession, he continued studies at the Pontifical Roman Seminary in Rome and was ordained in 1904, just after receiving his doctorate in theology. He returned home to Bergamo and taught Church history, apologetics, and patristics at the local seminary. Ten years later, he was drafted into the Royal Italian Army to serve as chaplain during the First World War.

Roncalli received many appointments, among them, Italian president of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, Apostolic Delegate to Turkey and Greece, and Apostolic Nuncio to Paris. Finally on October 28, 1958, he was elected Pope.

As Pope, he remained a gentle soul, walking the streets of Rome, visiting with locals, children, prisoners, and the sick. He was jovial and loving – a Pope of the people. This marked a shift in the papacy, bringing the

Shepherd of the Church to the people, and ultimately to the world.

This quest to be with the people of God was evident not only in his actions, but also in his writings. His encyclicals, such as *Pacem in terris* and *Mater et magistra*, sought to raise up the lowly and restore the fundamental human dignity belonging to all.

Yet it was a great surprise to the Church when, in 1962, Pope John XXII called the Second Vatican Council. He was thought to be a transitional Pope, not someone who would profoundly affect the universal Church and impact the modern world.

His reign as Pope was short-lived – only five years. He died from stomach cancer in the middle of the Council’s deliberation. Known as “Good Pope John”, his legacy remains in the reform he initiated, in his call for the Council, and in his efforts to break down everything that divided people from Christ.

May Christ inflame the desires of all men to breakthrough the barriers which divide them, to strengthen the bonds of mutual love, to learn to understand one another, and to pardon those who have done them wrong.

Wednesday Morning Bible Study

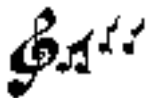
7-Part Series on the Gospel of Matthew (June 7, 14; July 5, 19; Aug. 2, 16 and Sept. 6)
