

Dear friends in Christ,

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. We commemorate that day when the Resurrected Jesus returned to the right hand of His Father, there to rule Heaven and Earth for all eternity, and we eagerly await His coming again.

The Second Coming (from the Greek "*parousia*," or arrival) is not something that I think too many Catholics spend much time dwelling on. It can seem to some to be almost an "evangelical" thing important only to televangelists, but of course it is not! From the earliest of times, Christians have always held firm to a belief that Jesus will come again and we even profess it in our Creed every Sunday. When that time will be, only God knows. Our task is to eagerly anticipate it and wait for it, but our waiting is not a passive waiting. We must not be caught, like the disciples, looking into the sky, but rather actively work here on Earth to prepare our hearts and our world to welcome Christ again. If we live a life worthy of our calling, we should have no fear of the Second Coming or dismiss it as something not relative to our faith. Indeed, it is the supreme hope and promise of our faith! Let us pray with all good people of faith: "Come, Lord Jesus! Come!"

Some of you may recall that the Ascension of the Lord is normally celebrated on a Thursday in the sixth week of Easter, and is a Holy Day of Obligation. In Texas and most other ecclesiastical provinces in the country, however, the local bishops have transferred the Solemnity of the Ascension to the 7th Sunday of Easter (this weekend) so that more people might rightly observe this important day.

Next Sunday, we close out the Easter seasons with Pentecost Sunday and the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate that Jesus promised He would send us. These great 50 days of Easter should continue to be lived in the presence of the risen Lord. May the Holy Spirit keep that flame of faith alive in our hearts throughout the year. Of course, Pentecost is a day when we traditionally wear red at Mass, and I encourage you to do so again this year.

Pentecost Sunday is also the day when the adult Catholics who have never been confirmed receive that important sacrament in the Church. This year, we here at Christ the Redeemer are a host parish for one of the six Confirmation masses throughout the archdiocese. It will be at 2 p.m. next Sunday. We will host about 12-15 other parishes and more than 100 adults, who have been preparing and studying throughout the Easter season, will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, including seven from CtR. We congratulate them and their families.

Next weekend is also Memorial Day weekend and the traditional beginning of summer vacation season. It's a time when mass attendance often drops off as people are out of town or away for weeks at a time. If I could ask one favor of you, however, it is that you remember the Church while you are away this summer. Please don't let your support of the Church take a vacation with you. You can send in or drop off your weekly offering at any time, and please stay up-to-date on your pledge payments to the *Our Faith, Our Future* Capital Campaign and the DSF pledges. We are dependent on your generosity and good stewardship throughout the year.

We have had a fairly steady stream of parents coming by the parish offices to register for next year's RE classes and we thank you for taking advantage of that early. We'll be holding registration throughout the summer, so come by any time but try to do it soon while it is on your mind. That will help us tremendously come next September when we get started again. Also, Summer Vacation Bible School is filling up quickly. Don't delay.

Finally, congratulations to our graduating high school seniors who we will honor at the 5 p.m. Sunday mass this weekend. We wish you well in your future endeavors. I've asked Stacie McKay from our CtR Young Adult group to start a database of all our college students so that we might keep you informed of what is going on at your home parish while you are away at college. All college students, regardless of your year of studies, are encouraged to e-mail Stacie (smckay@ctrcc.com) and let us know how we can keep you in touch.

Speaking of college kids, if you know of one with a strong back who is need of summer income have him contact Deacon Phillip in the parish office. We are in need of help around the parish physical plant. Our maintenance staff is short-handed at the moment. We'd love to find someone to lend us a hand over the next few months.

Don't forget that you are invited over to the new rectory for an Open House after masses this weekend. Come and see, but please, wipe your feet!

Seventh Sunday of Easter

Ascension to Glory

In many dioceses, today is celebrated as the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. This solemnity celebrates the last appearance of Jesus to the disciples after the Resurrection. All of the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) recount that Jesus summoned the disciples before his Ascension. From there he commissioned them to go out into the world to preach, to teach, to spread the Gospel, and to baptize. Luke's Gospel, which we hear today, includes a reference to the coming Spirit who will assist them in this mission.

In a way, the Ascension of Jesus to the right hand of the Father is only part of what we honor and commemorate today. The other part of this day is found in the great commission of Christ to his disciples. In their commission, we find ours as well. As the Church, the Body of Christ here on

earth, we too are sent by the risen ascended King. We too, are to go out and to lead others to Christ.

In this great Christian mission we find our inheritance, as the Opening Prayer for today's liturgy reminds us: In following Christ we are led into the new creation that will be fully established when he returns in glory at the end of time. At that time, as his followers, we too will be glorified with him. Eleven weeks ago, on the Second Sunday of Lent, we heard the account of the Transfiguration of the Lord – in which we see our future transformation promised to those who follow Christ. Today, in the Ascension we see a similar promised future as those who have been baptized into the death and resurrection of Christ: to sit with him at the end of time in the great kingdom of God. For this, as we pray today, is our glory and our hope.
