

Dear friends in Christ,

I suspect our attendance this weekend is going to dip slightly as many families will get away for a three-day weekend and the beginning of summer, but to all of you here I wish you a very happy and blessed Memorial Day. Let us take a moment or two this weekend to remember what the "memorial" in Memorial Day is all about. We thank all the men and women who have served or are serving now in the military services and for the great sacrifices they have made. We especially remember those who gave the ultimate sacrifice of their life so that all people the world over might live in peace. May God bless them all. Our offices will be closed on Memorial Day and re-open on Tuesday, May 30.

When we return after Memorial Day there will only be two more days of the month so let me remind you of a few important dates to keep in mind. First, our early registration for Religious Education classes will close on Wednesday, May 31. We will re-open registration in August, but I encourage you to take care of it now if at all possible. Our registration numbers are up more than 100 children over this same time last year so you can see that we have a great and growing demand for classes for the children. The sooner you register the sooner we will be able to determine class schedules and meeting spaces. Registration forms are available in the church office, in the narthex of the church and also on-line at [www.ctrcc.com](http://www.ctrcc.com). Remember, there is a mail-slot by the front door of the parish offices if you want to turn in your forms when the offices are closed.

In addition, space for Vacation Bible School is all but closed due to the tremendous amount of interest in it this year. We've made space for more children, but it is not enough to accommodate the demand. You should also keep in mind your planning for next fall and our Prep School for four- and five-year olds. That group, which meets each Tuesdays and Thursday, just completed the school year but is already at 85 percent capacity for next year. Registration forms are available in the parish office.

Also this week we ask for your prayers for our 120 high school youth who will make Confirmation on Thursday, June 1. We congratulate all of the teens and their families. My special thanks to all the catechists who helped prepare them for this sacrament, especially our youth ministers Santos Flores and C.J. McCarren. Not to be outdone by the youth are our eight adults who will be confirmed next Sunday, June 4, on the Feast of Pentecost. Remember that Pentecost Sunday is a wonderful day to join in the celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit by wearing the traditional Pentecost color of red.

If you were not at Mass last weekend you missed the announcement of the final figures for the 2006 Spring Festival. I know you have heard me say this before (and I hope to say it again and again and again!), but we set a new record with a total net profit of \$145,089.90. Wow! All the booths were off the charts in terms of success: the auction alone brought in more than \$78,000, the raffle, more than \$26,000, the great bar-be-que dinners, more than \$9,000, and so on. Even those blasted confetti eggs netted more than \$4,000 which means I better get used to getting cracked over the head with them for a few more years. With success like this, however, I don't mind! Thanks again to our wonderful core committee and booth chairpersons without whom this would not be possible. Of course, it goes without saying that the work of our general chairmen, Mike and Camille Havelka, is amazing. We owe them a tremendous amount of thanks. They are simply amazing. And to all of you who bought a

raffle ticket, played bingo, ate an egg roll, purchased a plant, tossed a ball or rode a ride, I say THANK YOU! I know of no other festival in all of the archdiocese that enjoys as much a success as ours at CtR. We should be rightfully proud of the work this community does. May God continue to bless us with many more years of great festivals. Thanks again!

Please join me in sending our condolences to Deacon Michael Nguyen and family over the death of his wife, Kim Anh, who passed away recently. Deacon Michael serves the Vietnamese Catholic community at Our Lady of Lavang Church and also plays an active role in the Vietnamese community which meets here at CtR each week for mass on Sundays at 6:30 p.m. Many of Nguyen family are faithful daily mass participants here and they offer a beautiful and rich Catholic tradition and culture to our parish. Fr. Ryszard and I concelebrated at Mrs. Nguyen's funeral at Our Lady of Lavang, and though we didn't understand the Vietnamese language, the faith of the hundreds of people gathered spoke volumes. Our prayers go out to the family.

**THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD**

**LITURGY CORNER**

**The Entrance**

“To you, O God, I lift up my soul” (Psalm 24:1; *Introit of the First Sunday of Advent*). The entrance chant, or introit, is like a door opening onto the mystery. It begins as the priest and other ministers enter the church. The entrance chant sets the celebration of Mass in motion; it fosters unity; it expresses something of the feast or season being celebrated. The entrance chant “begins as the priest enters with the deacon and ministers” and serves “to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical season or festivity, and accompany the procession of the priest and ministers” (GIRM, 47).

The choice of the entrance chant is determined by the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*. It may be the antiphon and psalm given in one of three official liturgical books: the *Roman Gradual*, the *Roman Missal*, or the *Simple Gradual*. The entrance chant may also be an antiphon and psalm from another source, or even a suitable liturgical song, provided that these have been approved by the Conference of Bishops or the diocesan Bishop (GIRM, 48).

Apart from few exceptions, the entrance chants of the Mass are drawn from the Bible, usually from the book of Psalms. It is significant that Mass opens with God’s word addressed to us. Already in the entrance chant, it is God who comes out to meet us.
