

Dear friends in Christ,

Last Friday I stopped by the "Back to School" junior high dance for a little while. A few observations: First, there was not a lot of dancing going on, at least when I was there, which, come to think of it reminds me of every junior high dance I attended at St. Luke Catholic Church here in Houston back in the day, as they say. Boys still stand to one side, girls to the other, though I am told that the dance floor was packed later in the night. Good to see that some things don't change. I told the kids that they should have Dan the DJ play "Rock Lobster." That was always the song that got everybody dancing back, but the kids looked at me like I was from another planet. Since when did the B-52s become an oldies band? It is tough getting old!

But what the dance really reinforced for me was the vitality of the youth of our parish. They were boisterous and fun-loving and enjoying themselves to the hilt. It was the first "dance" for many of them as they start the road of junior high and later high school. I thought how great that one of the great Catholic traditions continues to thrive. Kids still come to the parish hall for Friday night dances. I hope that these kids will keep these memories alive for years to come and continue to associate that life and vitality with the Church.

Finally, it was yet another reminder of "Our Faith, Our Future." Our parish is exceptionally young and our new facilities will serve us now and for years to come. It is for this generation of kids and the ones that will come after them that we must keep in mind. All of us build upon the work and generosity of the generations who came before us, and all of us have an obligation to see that future generations after us are served. It's part of the work of the Kingdom and it is a good and noble work. We are indebted to those who first made CtR possible more than 25 years ago. Now it is our turn to again further the growth of our community. Together we will do great things in the name of the Lord.

The registration period for our Religious Education classes this year closed this past Thursday. Some have asked why it is we shut off registrations after Sept. 1. The answer is, quite simply, size. By having a specific date for registrations we are thus able to take a few weeks to balance the class loads and assign students and teachers to each class. You would not believe the number of registrations that come pouring in, especially in the final few weeks. It is all that our RE department can do to get everything ready for the first day of classes on Sunday, Sept. 17. Please be patient as they finalize the class rosters. We owe Fredna, Pat, Debbie and Jill a tremendous amount of thanks for all their work on behalf of the students, and of course, we are very thankful for our catechists and aides.

Truth be told, if you did not yet register your child you will still be able to enroll them in classes for this year, but not until after the first day of classes. Check back with us after Sept. 17 and we will work with you. We do need these next few weeks, however, to process all the registrations that have come in already. So if, for whatever reason, you did not register your child before the cut-off date, please hold tight and we'll be happy to work with you once classes have begun. It's the only fair way to make the process work for our staff as well as the teachers and other students.

Speaking of catechists, we are still in need of a few to step forward to teach the children in the ways of the faith. Check the bulletin for the open days and times. We are especially in need of a few teachers for the junior high kids in Fairfield. If you have never been a catechist or are unsure of what it requires, please speak to Fredna in the RE office. She can get you trained and you will have the full support of the community. It is not an impossible task! Some of our best catechists were once like you and thought they "could never do that." But, lo and behold, the Lord has blessed them with the ability to bring the faith to the

children. We have an excellent educational support system for all our teachers and aides so please give it some prayerful thought and consider volunteering your time to teach in our RE department.

A reminder that our offices will be closed this Monday, Sept. 4, for Labor Day. We re-open on Tuesday, Sept. 5, which is also the first day of school for our CtR Prep School. The kids will be here each Tuesday and Thursday, so if you come to the office those days please be on the lookout for them. We are once again at capacity of 110 children and 22 teachers. Thanks to our director, Mary Davis, and all who make our Prep School such a success.

Finally, a reminder to those of you who are celebrating your 25th or 50th wedding anniversary this year, that two special masses will be held later this year by the archbishop to honor you. Couples wishing to participate and to receive a special blessing and certificate from Archbishop DiNardo are asked to call Margaret Carnicle in our Family Life office to register. Please step forward and let us honor you on this great occasion. You are a tremendous witness to the gift of married love in our parish. May God bless you throughout your anniversary year.

## LITURGY CORNER

### The Liturgy of the Eucharist

“I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, ‘This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.’ In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, ‘This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me’” (Corinthians 11:23-25).

The Mass is the sacrifice of Christ and the banquet of his body and blood. It is the mystery of Christ’s Cross and Resurrection made present in our “here and now,” the foretaste on earth of “what God has prepared for those who love him” (1 Corinthians 2:9) at the heavenly “supper of the Lamb” (Revelation 19:9).

The Liturgy of the Eucharist unfolds in three movements: the Preparation of the Gifts, the Eucharistic Prayer, and the Breaking of the Bread to be given in Holy Communion. The Mass thus corresponds precisely to the words and actions of Christ: “When he was at table with them, he *took* the bread and *blessed*, and *broke* it, and *gave* it to them” (Luke 24:30).
