

Dear friends in Christ,

Six weeks ago we held a town hall meeting to discuss our music ministry at CtR. It was a very good meeting with about 40-50 people in attendance. Everyone got to contribute to the meeting and we have been working ever since then to take what we heard and incorporate those ideas into our liturgical planning.

Music is integral to the Liturgy of the Church. At CtR, this could not be more true. We love music and we love to offer our praise to God in song. In response to the information we gathered at the meeting and the meetings that flowed from that gathering we have made some changes. While trying to remain faithful to the Church's many teaching documents about music and its role in the liturgy, we are also trying to find good music that is meaningful for us as a community and allows us to sing fully and freely. After all, that is the reason the Church has taught extensively on this subject. Singing is the highest form of prayer. When we sing, we pray twice.

You may have noticed that we are singing more familiar music. This was a group effort. We heard what you said about the music, positive and negative, and we are responding. We will use new songs from time to time, but we will strive to teach some new songs well. Music that we feel may be unfamiliar with the whole assembly will be reviewed prior to the start of the mass. Especially at liturgies where music is led by a cantor, we need to develop a stronger sense of the reality that the assembly is the "choir." *Singing the liturgy* rather than singing *at* the liturgy is the desire of Archbishop DiNardo for parishes in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston.

Singing is part of our call to full, conscious and active participation. So, what to do? Well, join in! Grab a hymnal and use it as songs are announced. Use the worship aid and the hymn boards to assist you in finding the music for that particular mass. Together we can make the liturgies at our parish joyful celebrations that have a deeper meaning in our lives and feed us throughout the week until we gather to celebrate again. I will tell you that as a presider at liturgy, there is nothing more disheartening than to look at the congregation and see some (not a lot, but some) people with arms folded and lips buttoned. Seriously, it looks like they would rather be anywhere else but in church. They look like they are going to the firing squad! Where's the joy? Folks, we are here to praise and worship a God who loves us and saves us. Trust me, this is a good thing! A very good thing!

This past Sunday we returned to a familiar "setting" of the mass. It's called the *Mass of the Angels and Saints* and is used here in our archdiocese and throughout the country. Over time, it will become known by heart, but for now it is in the worship aid. We change settings of the Mass during the different liturgical seasons of the year (and once also during the long Ordinary Time) to highlight the significance of the season. All mass settings feature important or "preeminent" sung parts of the liturgy. This means if we sang nothing at all, we should still strive to join in singing at least four parts of the Mass: the Gospel Acclamation, the Sanctus (or Holy, Holy, Holy), the Memorial Acclamation and the Great Amen. This Amen is called GREAT because it is our affirmation and statement of belief in the miracle that has just happened at the altar where Christ is now present with us at the climax and conclusion of the Eucharistic prayer.

Finally, the Church revised the Lectionary in recent years but still provides us some psalms that we can use seasonally. That choice is left to the music director, liturgist or pastor. The reason for this is once again to strive for full participation of all present. The words may not match exactly what you find in the missal. This doesn't mean we are not in harmony with the Church, rather, it means we are striving to provide music the community knows and sings well. The goal to

be fostered above all other goals is the participation of all the faithful.

You will also notice that we have lowered the volume on the organ. This remains a work in progress as the company that built and installed the organ has serviced it several times in the past few weeks. It's a sophisticated instrument of both mechanical and electrical parts and when one thing goes bad it throws off the entire pitch and sound. Our organist, Tim Duhr, is also adjusting his playing style to accommodate the needed changes, but we continue to ask for your patience. We are getting there. Finally, I thank all for their input and especially Stephen Sloper and our music ministry team who are working diligently to provide us with beautiful music each and every week. We are blessed to have such a talented and dedicated music ministry.

In other news, today is Catechetical Sunday and the first day of our Religious Education classes for the year. Thank you to all parents who registered your children for classes and a very big thank you to all who have volunteered as teachers and aides. As of today we have more than 1,700 children enrolled in RE. That's a number that simply boggles my mind, and it will certainly go up in the coming weeks as we bring in some last-minute additions. If you did not register your child already, you may do so beginning on Tuesday, Sept. 26 at 2 p.m. in the church office. Please do not miss this last-chance for registration. We don't want the children to miss too many classes.

We are still in need of three teachers to fill out our classes. Please see the RE information corner elsewhere in the bulletin and consider working together with another parent to teach the class. We are blessed to have wonderful parents take an active role in our RE program. We need you! Many thanks to all who stepped forward for this important ministry.

Finally, the annual Casino Night is Saturday, Sept. 30. It's a fund-raiser for the RCIA group and youth ministry and it's always one of the most highly anticipated nights on the parish calendar. Tickets go on sale this weekend after mass and, because of space limitations; we can only sell 250 of them. Get your tickets early. This event always sells out, so don't delay. It's a great night of fun to benefit two important ministries. Peace, Fr. Sean

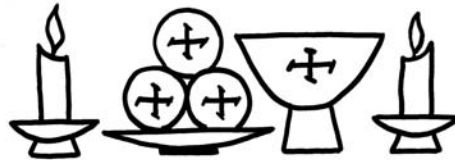
LITURGY CORNER

Let Our Hearts Be Lifted High!

The Eucharistic Prayer opens in a lyrical dialogue between the priest and people. "The Lord be with you. And also with you." Here, the familiar greeting becomes more solemn. Poised on the threshold of the mysteries, priest and people together recognize that they are about to be enveloped in Christ's own prayer to the Father. "Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord." Every heart is held aloft; nothing is held back. "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise." In ancient times, this response had the quality of a thunderous affirmation, solemn and spontaneous all at once.

The preface follows; a song of immense jubilation, a poem of thanks giving to the glory of the Father. The Roman Missal contains a variety of prefaces. Each one begins by acknowledging that the Father is always and everywhere worthy of thanksgiving. The middle part, drawing upon the wonders of creation and redemption, presents a specific reason for giving thanks. The final part soars heavenward, asking that our voices may be joined to those of the angelic choirs. The preface, by its very nature, cries out to be sung. The world's greatest musicians have recognized in the traditional melody of the preface, a composition of unequalled simplicity and majesty.
